The university came into school last week and held assemblies with our Yr9 students. Following these assemblies our Yr9 First Generation Scholars cohort took part in a workshop. During this workshop students heard about the Scheme and the activities they will be taking part in during 2015/16. These will include a Falmer campus tour and being part of their Making Choices programme which includes STEM which is science based and Social Sciences including Law, Politics and Sociology.




