## “The expert in anything was once a beginner”

The move into a new year is always a good time to think about the future. We want to encourage all our students from Year 7 to Year 11 to think about their future beyond Ratton in education and work. To encourage them, we have a strong careers programme that starts in Year 7 and builds up though to Year 11. There are at least 3 examples in this newsletter about how we help prepare our students for their future careers.

It was wonderful to walk round the Year 11 interview day talking to all the business volunteers who were interviewing our students. It was the same day as a visit from our local MP, Stephen Lloyd, so it was pleasure to share how our community links were benefitting our students. It has also been interesting to talk to Year 11 students and find out how they have used the interview skills they developed during that day for college interviews.

Trying to develop new and exciting ideas is very important in the world of work. If innovation is your thing then please read about the team that have designed a sustainable Handy Hydro turbine to generate electricity. In the short film clip of their project, they demonstrate a whole range of work-based skills from project planning to teamwork.

Finally, a group of Year 10 students went to a hotel to gain first-hand experience of a formal catering environment. They had the opportunity to watch a professional Head Chef demonstrate the skills to produce a 3 course meal and reflect on whether they were interested in pursuing careers in catering.

# ULTIMATE STEM CHALLENGE 2017-18

The **Ultimate STEM Challenge** (science, technology, engineering and maths) has been designed to help young people develop their creativity, problem-solving skills and employability by tackling real-world challenges by exploring the practical uses of science. Teams of two to four students aged 11 to 14, from across the UK, can enter the competition and win some fantastic prizes, including an invitation to a celebratory event at the Science Museum, an Ultimate STEM experience day, £500 for their school and Science Museum goodies!

This year's theme – My Sustainable Future – will see young people develop solutions to one of three real-world challenges which will reduce natural resource use or bring down greenhouse gas emissions.

We are delighted to say that **Sam Brown, Mackenzie Nelson, Izzy Pike and Douglas Potter** have collaborated to produce a 'Handy Hydro' turbine from scratch for generating electricity from moving water and is real proof of their passion for STEM.

# Mixed Media Textile Artist, Katie Essams, is inspired by everyday beauty to combine freehand machine embroidery, appliqué, paint, crochet and more to create her original textile pieces

Since graduating in 2011 from the University of Hertfordshire with a BA Hons in Contemporary Applied Art Katie Essam, mixed media textile artist - has been struck with a passion for textiles. So having taught herself freehand machine embroidery, appliqué and many other textile techniques, she combines them to make original framed, mixed media textile art pieces, inspired by the beauty in everyday objects and vintage.

Katie runs tuition sessions, teaching freehand machine embroidery and appliqué, and needle felting workshops and our GCSE Art Textiles students were delighted with her recent visit to Ratton to further assist them with their portfolio artwork.


# Year 10 Food & Cookery Group visit The Langham Hotel
