Ratton is committed to delivering high quality RSHE to all students in an age appropriate way. It is delivered by subject specialists as part of Ethics.

From September 2020 RSHE will be statutory in all schools. The Government Guidance can be found here: **Government Guidance On Relationships, Sex and Health Education**

The Ethics department have developed our curriculum in conjunction with the students, using the resources provided from East Sussex County Council, Sex Education Forum and the PSHE association.

This overview of the lessons has been produced to inform parents and carers of what will be covered by students. We agree with the DFe statement that says;

"We are clear that parents and carers are the prime educators for children on many of these matters. Schools complement and reinforce this role and have told us that they see building on what pupils learn at home as an important part of delivering a good education."

The RSHE Curriculum is divided into the two themes:

- o Health
- Relationships and Sex Education.

The topics that must be covered are outlined in the boxes below along with the theme covered and when the topic will be delivered.

The lessons marked with an asterisk are also part of the GCSE syllabus for Religious Studies. Students explore the theme of human relationships from religious, ethical and non-religious points of view.

Parents of secondary school children do have the right to excuse them from the Sex Education lessons up to 3 full terms before the students 16th birthday.

Students will:

Students will:

- Discuss why consent (in the general sense) links with respect and selfrespect.
- Know what the law says about sexual consent
- Consider ways in which sexual consent can be discussed in an intimate relationship.

Lesson 3: Readiness for Intimacy

Students will:

- Identify ways in which people express attraction and love without sexual intimacy
- Consider the responsibilities and risks involved with intimate sexual relationships
- Build confidence in communicating about readiness for sexual intimacy

Term 1

Lesson 4: Contraception

Students will:

- Be able to explain a range of contraception methods
- Identify ways to use a condom effectively
- Overcome common barriers to accessing and using contraception and sexual health service

Lesson 5: Unplanned pregnancy

Students will:

- Identify emergency contraception and where they can be accessed
- recognise signs and symptoms of pregnancy and know how to ask for help as soon as pregnancy is suspected
- understand what abortion is, including the legal status consider a range of beliefs and opinions related to abortion.

Term 1

Lesson 6: Sexual Health

Students will:

- Know that intimate sexual relationships carry the risk of sexually transmitted infection
- be able to explain a range of ways to reduce the risk of sexually transmitted infection
- To overcome barriers that prevents young people accessing sexual health services

Term 1

Lesson 7: HIV and Aids

Students will:

- Be able to Explain the differences between HIV and AIDS
- know how HIV can be transmitted and how the risk can be reduced

Students will:

Students will:

- Critically analyse messages in the media about mental illness

Lesson 16: Mental Health-Different types of mental health issues

Students will:

- Know Symptoms of different mental health issues

Lesson 19: Cannabis-The Law

Students will:

- Know Current UK legislation regarding possession and use of cannabis
- critically appraise sources all the information about cannabis
- Show understanding of the different classes of illegal drugs

Term 6

Lesson 20: Cannabis and Mental Health

Students will:

- Explore the range of risks associated with cannabis uses
- Demonstrate an awareness of why early cannabis use has an increased risk to mental health
- Critically evaluate why some young people engage in cannabis use despite knowing the risks

Students will:

- Explore the specific issues raised by use of cannabis and learning
- demonstrate an awareness of the neurological effects of cannabis on memory

Students will:

Students will:

- Demonstrate understanding of what interviewers are looking for in candidates
- Have an opportunity to practice interview skills
- be aware of some of the common mistakes made at interview

Lesson 25: Stereotypes and Media awareness

Students will:

- Identify it media idealised images constructed around gender
- interpret how media messages impact on self-esteem and body image
- consider and a range of views relating to cosmetic surgery and identifying long term effects of such surgery

Lesson 26: Body Image-Selfies

Students will:

- Reflect on the use and purpose of selfies
