Barrington Stoke Books

Books produced with tinted pages, special fonts and spacing, thicker paper and editing to reduce comprehension barriers and/or issues resulting from dyslexia.

AUDIOBOOKS

Helps students engage in text and gain exposure to more words, improving vocabulary, comprehension, and critical thinking skills.

TURN ON THE SUBTITLES

Turning on the subtitles while children are watching television can double the chances of a child becoming good at reading


